CoPT to provide onshore power to berthed ships

Move aimed at adhering to IMO guidelines

KOCHI, Feb. 14

WITH the Cochin Port Trust's (CoPT) decision to offer onshore power to berthed ships, the vessels calling at the Port will soon be able to reduce their energy con-

Being part of the Port's efforts to adhere to the climate guidelines of IMO pertaining to shipping and to lower air pollution, the move is expected to cut emissions from ships as the berthed vessels will be able to switch off their engines.

The process of supplying onshore power, on an experimental basis, to ships berthed at the Port was initiated

While apprising that generators were being used for powering the berthed ships, Port officials said that the idea was suggested by a shipping company, which reportedly convinced the Port

Trust that the utilisation of onshore power could result in cutting its fuel costs considerably.

From now on, ships berthed at the port for longer periods, i.e. more than three days, will be provided with power supply from the shore until the time they set sail. a CoPT official said. Henceforth, the ships' auxiliary engines, which power the systems operation, would be turned off to cut diesel consumption.



Exports of organic food products surges 33 pc

NEW DELHI, Feb. 14 A TOP official brought to light recently that exports of organic food products jumped by 33 per cent to \$ 157 million in 2010-11.

During the period, the country exported around 70,000 million tonnes compared to 58,000 million tonnes in the previous year, he said

Apprising that around 300 products, under 19 categories, were exported last vear, Mr S. Dave, Director, Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (Apeda). said that oilseeds topped the list with a share of 26
